WEEE Banks



- Small electrical and electronic equipment, including:
 - Phones
 - Remote controls
 - Kettles
 - Irons
 - Toasters
 - Radios
 - Clocks
 - Small DIY tools

Carton Banks



- Drink cartons, soup cartons, Tetra Paks, etc.
- WEEE and Carton banks are both located at:
 - Hungerford Train Station Car Park
 - Newbury HWRC (Newtown Road)
 - Kingsland Centre Car Park, Thatcham
 - Padworth HWRC
 - Sainsbury's Car Park, Calcot
